Project rationale	 The aim of the project is to review the Dudley diabetes pathway, service, and current health requirements of the diabetic population that it serves. To ensure this overarching aim is met, the project will focus on reviewing three key areas: The current diabetic pathway and population need By completing a population health analysis of subgroups of type 1 and type 2 diabetic patients and mapping of the current diabetes pathway to identify any potential gaps in the service and future need. This will formulate a static infographic dashboard. DNA of specialist diabetic appointments By interviewing clinical and administrative staff to understand reasoning of DNA, and by conducting a population health inequalities. Diabetic foot amputations By analysing diabetic foot amputation data to identify trends of health inequality, and mapping of the current footcare pathway and service to identify potential gaps in service. Thus, resulting in an independent diabetic foot care peer review of the diabetic pathway and service. By completing the above objectives, the project will produce an options appraisal and considerations for recommendations that may be implemented by the Dudley IHCT if appropriate.
